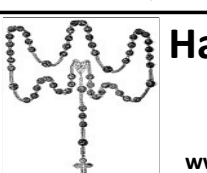
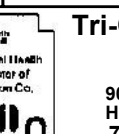

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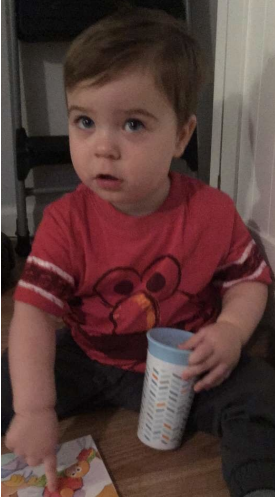

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross: This feast on September 14th was observed in Rome before the end of the seventh century. It commemorates the recovery of the Holy Cross, which had been placed on Mt. Calvary by St. Helena and preserved in Jerusalem, but then had fallen into the hands of Chosroas, King of the Persians. The precious relic was recovered and returned to Jerusalem by Emperor Heraclius in 629. The lessons from the Breviary tell us that Emperor Heraclius carried the Cross back to Jerusalem on his shoulders. He was clothed with costly garments and with ornaments of precious stones. But at the entrance to Mt. Calvary a strange incident occurred. Try as hard as he would, he could not go forward. Zacharias, the Bishop of Jerusalem, then said to the astonished monarch: "Consider, O Emperor, that with these triumphal ornaments you are far from resembling Jesus carrying His Cross." The Emperor then put on a penitential garb and continued the journey.

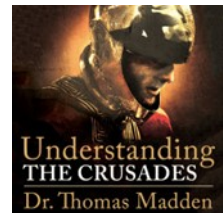

REGISTRATION FORMS are available in the back of our Churches or can be printed off the Holy Family Parish website (hfpmc.org) under "Religious Education," then "Parish School of Religion." Medical release forms for all students must be filled out this year. Return completed forms to your respective site coordinators. Online sign-up will also be conducted by the site coordinators for those who choose to do so. The schedule and location of classes has changed this year to the following:

Marion (MN): Grades 1-8—Classes meet Sundays 10:00-11:15 am, beginning Sept. 16.

Pilsen (PL): Grades 1-8—Classes meet Wednesdays 4:00-5:15 pm, beginning Sept. 19.

Tampa (TM): Grades 1-8—Classes meet Wednesdays 7:15-8:30 pm, beginning Sept. 19.

High School TM/PL/MN: Classes meet **Wednesdays** 7:00-8:30 pm in PL beginning Sept. 19: all H.S. boys - PL Church Basement; all H.S. girls - Laura Klenda's home in PL.

Catholic Youth Ministry (CYM) for High School will meet in MAC on the 1st Wednesday of each month, 7:00-8:30 pm.

"ALL SCHOOL PSR MASS" is a new twist from the way we've previously celebrated PSR Masses. There will be 5 Masses for PSR students from all sites throughout the year, with the location rotating. There will be no classes held this night. Fr. Bebak will be available for Confessions 20 minutes before Mass. All students & teachers from ALL sites are expected to attend these special Masses for the spiritual benefit of our catechists and PSR students. Students sit with their family. All parishioners are invited, as the morning Mass will be cancelled.

CHANGES TO 1ST COMMUNION PROGRAM: First Communion and First Confession preparation will no longer be a two-year program, but will be completed during the second grade. A mandatory meeting for the parents of children receiving First Confession and Communion will be held on Wed., Sept 12th in the MAC after the 7pm PSR Mass. First Confession for all children will be held on Sat., May 4, 2019 at the Marion church at 9am, followed by First Communion practice. First Communion will be held on Sun., May 5, 2019 at Marion and Pilsen.
