CAMPAIGN NEWS

Our parish goal for the Campaign is \$335,000, of which we will keep 20% within our parish for a specific need. If we go over our goal, our parish will receive 80% of every dollar raised in excess! Our parish has gone through a careful process of consultation and discernment to determine what the most pressing needs are in our community. This may seem daunting, but Bishop Kemme and we have every confidence in our Catholic community to rally around these important goals. We recognize that every parishioner cannot and should not participate in the same way and give the same dollar amount. But I am asking every parishioner to consider a sacrificial gift that is proportionate to the blessings you have received.

All registered families will receive an appeal packet in the mail. In the packet, you will receive our case statement brochure, explaining the goals of the campaign and the five priorities funded by it, along with a case insert that describes in detail the projects that our parish will address with our Individual Parish Needs funding. You will also find a letter from Bishop Kemme inviting you to consider a specific amount to pledge to the campaign. The request that you make a sacrificial gift is based on our confidence in the generosity of our parish community as well as the significant needs we currently face. We have bold dreams and Bishop Kemme is asking everyone to do what they can to help make those dreams a reality for our local Church.

Please remember that this request is an invitation, not an expectation. Ultimately, whatever gift you can make, after prayerful discernment, is a gift we will receive with deep gratitude.
